**Choco-Story is open...** from Tuesday to Sunday from 10 am to 5 pm. (last entrance at 4.30 pm). Closed on Monday (except Mondays which are public holidays). Closed the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> weeks of January.
